EQUIPMENT	PROVIDED AT MUTEMWA / SIOMA	SUGGESTED EXTRAS TO BRING
<b>RODS</b>	Sturdy, short base trolling rods and 7ft spinning rods. No fly rods	Only if you favour your own or wish to buy – Shimano Tiger Tamer is a good option. 8/9 weight fast action fly rod.
<b>REELS</b>	Basic coffee grinders – Shimano. No fly reels.	A worthwhile extra to bring or buy – we recommend a good drag system that can fight fish under tension. Large arbour, smooth drag fly reel.
<b>LINE</b>	20-25lb nylon monofilament. No fly lines.	Braid if you prefer this – we recommend Suffix or JDB of about 35lb strength. 8/9 weight fast sinking or fast sinking tip fly line.
<b>TRACES</b>	#4 Piano wire and #10 power swivels.	35lb Knot 2 Kinky – a very good knot-able wire that doesn't kink. #10 power swivels.
<b>LURES</b>	9cm & 11cm Rapala floating magnums and 6cm Fat Raps.	Additional rapalas (X-Rap range) or a new brand like the Oarsome Oargee's in the 1m - 5m swimming depth. The Oargee Pee Wee lures are also very good. Fire tiger, hot tiger, red head and shiners are very good colours to use.
<b>SPOONS</b>	A small selection of effzetts.	18g and 22g double bladed copper effzetts.
<b>SPINNERS</b>	A small selection of Mepps Black Fury	Mepps Black Fury #3 and #4
<b>FLIES</b>	None provided	Heavily weighted, sparsely dressed flies like clousers or whistlers in natural colours with a bit of flash.
<b>BAIT</b>	Bait hooks provided.	Live bait traces.

# FISHING TECHNIQUES

STYLE	SEASON	SUCCESS RATE
TROLLING	Medium to low water levels when the water is starting to get clearer. (May – Dec)	Very good way of covering water and fishing lures at depth where big fish are often found
SPIN & FLY	All year round although better results often experienced when water levels are slightly higher (Mar – Dec)	Spinning fat raps and effzets around the structure and the rapids is always a productive way of fishing. Best results experienced when working structure, channels or drifting along the banks.
BAIT	Drift baiting in high water levels during March and April.	Drift baiting can be very good early in the season.

REELS	Basic coffee grinders – Shimano. No fly reels.	A worthwhile extra to bring or buy – we recommend a good drag system that can fight fish under tension. Large arbour, smooth drag fly reel.
LINE	20-25lb nylon monofilament. No fly lines.	Braid if you prefer this – we recommend Suffix or JDB of about 35lb strength. 8/9 weight fast sinking or fast sinking tip fly line.
TRACES	#4 Piano wire and #10 power swivels.	35lb Knot 2 Kinky – a very good knot-able wire that doesn't kink. #10 power swivels.
LURES	9cm & 11cm Rapala floating magnums and 6cm Fat Raps.	Additional rapalas (X-Rap range) or a new brand like the Oarsome Oargee's in the 1m - 3m swimming depth. The Oargee Pee Wee lures are also very good. Fire tiger, hot tiger, red head and crawdad are very good colours to use.
SPOONS	A small selection of effzets.	18g and 22g double bladed copper effzets.
SPINNERS	A small selection of Mepps Black Fury	Mepps Black Fury #3 and #4
FLIES	None provided	Heavily weighted, sparsely dressed flies like clousers or whistlers in natural colours with a bit of flash.

TROLLING	Very good way of covering water and keeping your lure consistently in the strike zone.
SPIN & FLY	Spinning fat raps and effzetts around the structure and the deeper channels is always a productive way of fishing. Best results experienced when working structure, channels or drifting along the banks.
